**Language P1/2 Section A:** Critical reading and comprehension: identifying and interpreting themes, ideas and information in a range of literature and other high-quality writing.

**Language P1/2 Section B:** producing clear and coherent text: writing effectively for different purposes and audiences: to describe, narrate, explain, instruct, give and respond to information and argue.

**Literature P2 Section b/c Poetry:** students will answer one comparative question on one named poem printed on the paper and one other poem from their chosen anthology cluster. Section C Unseen poetry: Students will answer one question on one unseen poem and one question comparing this poem with a second unseen poem.

**Literature P1 Section A Shakespeare:** students will answer one question on their play of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the play and then to write about the play
