Primary Teaching

Teaching by Mr Nagy

Mereside CE Primary School



In Spring 1 Mr Nagy has been delivering specialist "booster" lessons to specific children to develop confidence, regulate emotions and improve health and wellbeing. The lessons are short, sharp interventions that develop key gross/fine motor skills and allow children to access learning in a fun and safe

environment. The children have enjoyed the activities so far and will continue their progress this term.





Oakmeadow CE Primary School



During the Spring term Mr Nagy has been teaching year 4 gymnastics to meet the national curriculum aim of developing flexibility, strength technique, control and balance. In conjunction with year 4 staff Mr Nagy taught pupils how to safely create and develop a routine and improve it using peer feedback. Year 4 pupils were able to incorporate counter balances, rolls and jumps in their floor

sequences and improve their performance using elements such as cannon and presenting.













St Thomas and St Anne's CE Primary School

Whilst at St Thomas and St Anne Mr Nagy has been working hard with year 2 /3 and Year 6 to teach gymnastics and help children develop basic movements and increase strength, flexibility, technique, control and balance. During the half term year 2 / 3 developed ways of travelling on / off equipment, improved basic movements, learnt how to perform rolls safely and were able to link short movements to create and refine sequences. Year 6 developed and furthered key skills in travelling, balancing and rolling but also progressed onto flight.

Mr Nagy also worked with year 1 and reception to develop a fun net and wall scheme of work. Children were taught to move with confidence, safety and with control and co-ordination. They used a range of equipment such as tennis rackets to play modified net and wall games to meet the national curriculum objective of handling objects with increasing control.





Competitions and Events

Dodgeball—Key Stage 2

70 participants from 6 schools took part in a thrilling dodgeball tournament on the 12th January at Mary Webb school. Led by Mr Nagy and the sports leaders from Mary Webb schools battled it out to make it through to the final which eventually was won by Trinity CE Primary School. Mr Nagy commented how well all schools had done and gave a special mention to Minsterley Primary School who earned the School Games Honesty Value award.

Year 3 / 4 Inclusion

Over 120 pupils with an SEND need attended an Inclusion festival held at Meole Brace on the 19th January. Pupils got to take part in 3 different events – Boccia, New Aged kurling and Tri golf. All the activities were smoothly led by year 9 sports leaders from Meole Brace and helped make the event a huge success. Teachers from attending schools commented on how much children had enjoyed the events and how attentive leaders had been.





Sportshall Athletics—Key stage 2

150 + participants from 9 different schools attended the School Games Sportshall Athletics qualifier at Mary Webb on 26th January. This fiercely contested event saw children take part in indoor track and field events overseen by Mr Nagy, Mr Jew and the Sports leaders from Mary Webb. The overall winners that now go through to the School Games Finals to represent Shrewsbury were Greenfields Girls and Meole Brace Boys.

Basketball Finals—Key stage 2

The four successful teams met on the 31st January to play out who would represent the Shrewsbury area in basketball at the School Games in May. The games were of very high quality with end to end basketball being played making it a tiring night for the leaders of Meole Brace who refereed the games with distinction. Year 5 / 6 Swimming Gala

This event took place at the prestigious Shrewsbury School who kindly hosted a fantastic swimming gala for 60 mixed gender children. Mr Nagy led the event with the help from Meole Brace leaders to officiate and oversee a large number of extremely competitive races including 50m freestyle, 25m butterfly and everyone's favourite, the medleys. The standard of swimming was very good making St Georges Primary Schools winning total all the more impressive. The event proved to be really well received by all prompting Mr Nagy to organise a County Swim Gala – watch this Space!

Year 3 / 4 and Year 5/6 Football Leagues
