Meole Brace Ski Trip 2023



In the last week of February, 49 students from Meole Brace School took to the snowy slopes at les Menuires in Trois Vallées in France. This was a return visit to an area last visited in 2018. Conditions were glorious, with sunshine and blue skies each day. In an area with 370 different trails to roam, students made the very best of their time exploring all over the valley with new routes being attempted each day.

Students had an excellent time and made amazing progress over the six days. Some had previously skied and others had never been on a pair of skis before. Under the expert tuition of the instructors, the majority of groups progressed onto the red and blue slopes, enjoying views of Mont Blanc in the distance from heights of up to 2800 metres. Shooting over the jumps in the Snow Park was a great source of amusement, with students taking to the air with varying degrees of success!

It was an action-packed time for all, and everyone embraced the opportunity to try new things. Students took the opportunity to practise their French, and are proud of their many new skiing skills, in some cases even including 360 degree turns (on purpose!).







Locked Up!



Meole Brace RE and Sociology students took part in our annual trip to the Dana prison in Shrewsbury. The trip gave students a fantastic opportunity to engage with a range of ideas, enriching the experience of their GCSE course external to the classroom environment. As part of their GCSE, RE students cover a unit of 'Crime and Punishment', and GCSE Sociology students cover 'Crime and Deviance'. This trip allowed students to gain a greater understanding surrounding the concepts of crime, punishment and the treatment of criminals, thus making connections between ideas and concepts we learn in the classroom, and real-life experience.





Locked Up!





Whilst on the trip, students were be given a guided tour of the prison, which was carried out by ex-officers who used to work at the Dana Prison. Whilst being shown around, the students were able to hear stories about the prison, how it was run and how criminals were treated. They enjoyed discussing as to whether prison is an effective form of punishment, or if there were better means to punishing criminals. There was not one consensus drawn, however students thoroughly enjoyed deliberating and debating this concept. Students also took part in a 'prisoner experience', dressing up in orange jump suits so they all looked the part! They completed a 'cell escape' experience, where students were put into groups in cells, and had to try to work out a code-breaker in order to escape the cell! Both students and staff enjoyed this experience, with the students asking the prison officers lots of questions about the prison and how it was run.


